


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Bit Of History: Rembrandt

Born in 1606 in Leiden, the Netherlands, Rembrandt began his life being able to play in and around a windmill as his parents owned one. Many of his early works and sketches had windmills in them. In 1621, he became an apprentice to a local artist where he learned to grind paints, stretch and prepare canvas and to make prints and in 1624 he travelled to Amsterdam to assist Pietre Lastman (a well known history scene painter). This was his formal education to become a painter. After a year, he moved back to Leiden and arranged to have his own studio space. Over the years he took on students/apprentices and began to make a name for himself, especially with portraiture. There were no cameras during that time but Rembrandt enjoyed painting self portraits and he painted quite a few throughout his life. More than any other famous artist. He also loved his family and they were used as models in many of his paintings. Want to learn more about Rembrandt? Check out the book "Getting to Know the World's Greatest Artists: Rembrandt" out of the SWCA library.

Tips for Acrylic Painters and Mural Artists for Estimating Paint Coverage.

As an artist, you know that calculating how much paint you need for a project is crucial for budgeting and achieving the desired results. Painting large canvases or murals requires a lot of colour, time, and effort, so you don't want to run out of material mid-project.
