

A BIT OF HISTORY - Georgia O'Keefe

Georgia O'Keefe was born on a large farm in Wisconsin, November 15, 1887. Her parents encouraged her young artistic talents and by the time she finished high school, she knew she wanted to become an artist. Something that not many women of that time felt they could do. She studied at both the Art Institute of Chicago and then the Art Students League in New York. There she learned the techniques of traditional painting but within 4 years her painting direction altered dramatically after studying the abstract works of Arthur Wesley Dow. For two years she taught art in West Texas and loved the wide open spaces. Here she found the close-up beauty of bones/skulls and created abstract charcoal drawings to better express her feelings and ideas. She sent a few of these drawings to a friend in New York and that friend showed them to Alfred Stieglitz, an art dealer and well known photographer. In 1916, he became the first person to exhibit her work and they would eventually fall in love and marry.

They lived in a tall New York skyscraper and she began a series of paintings depicting New York skyscrapers, quite a modern subject of that time and she also began her close-up depictions of flowers and by the mid-1920s, Georgia became known as one of America's most important and successful artists.

In 1929, she made the first of many trips to northern Mexico. It's landscapes and Hispanic cultures of the region inspired a new direction in her artwork. For the next 2 decades she spent most summers living and working in New Mexico and 3 years after her husband's death, she made it her permanent home.

She started a whole new life there with lots of international travelling which inspired her to paint spectacular views in her interesting style, from mountains to interesting views of clouds, to seashells and of course, flowers. 

Maybe we should go?




