

Bring in up to 2 pieces of work to be critiqued. They do not have to be finished.






SWCA Extras

"Getting to Know the World's Greatest Artists" Pablo Picasso

We all know him as Pablo Picasso. In actuality, his real name was Pablo Diego Jose Francisco de Paula Juan Nepomuceno Maria de los Remedios Cipriano de la Santisima Trinidad Ruiz y Picasso. Wow! In Malaga, Spain, where Pablo was born 1881, people named their babies to honour their parents, relatives and saints. Pablo's parents probably wanted to make sure they did not leave anyone out. Pablo Picasso was introduced to the art world at a very young age as his father was an art teacher at the local school. By the age of 15, he was already quite an incredible painter as seen in this piece: The Alter Boy. 1896





But he was one to always try new things and he went through quite a few different styles each lasting several years: The Blue Period, The Pink Period, Cubism, etc. He was influenced by African Art and from ancient Roman Sculptures. He was not just a painter, but dived into ceramics and sculptures as well. He is one of a few artists that during his life, actually became quite famous and rich from his work and was able to enjoy this for most of his long life. 
